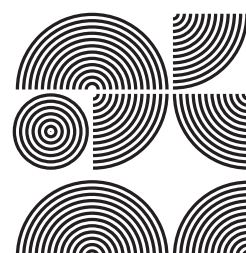
A Value-Driven Olympic Ecosystem

Strategic Objectives

- Promoting Olympic values and ethics as the foundation of a values-driven sporting ecosystem, placing the athlete at the centre of every safety and safe sport commitment.
- Encouraging interdisciplinary research that speaks directly to the athlete, working across the multidisciplinary challenges of safe sport, performance and athlete welfare together, rather than treating them as separate concerns.
- Building a platform for athlete representation and empowerment, with particular attention to young, women and para-athletes within Indian sport.
- Bring every stakeholder in the sporting ecosystem, physical education teachers, coaches, administrators and organizations, into one shared, values-driven conversation on governance and safeguarding accomplishing the athlete-centred approach at every level of the system.

Key Features and New Initiatives

- The Asian National Olympic Academy Summit, the first dedicated platform bringing Asian NOAs together to share Olympic education initiatives.
- The India Safe Sport Charter, opened for endorsement by participating federations and institutions across the three days.
- The National Sports Good Governance Award, presented under the NSGO framework.
- The Coach's Corner, an informal networking space for coaching staff running through all three days.
- The Call for Stories, a track for practitioners, coaches and athletes to share lived experience alongside the formal academic program.

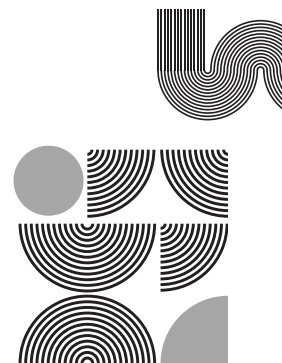
