By inviting eminent legal scholars, practitioners, and policymakers, the programme ensures diverse perspectives, enriching the learning experience. The program acts as a vibrant forum for thought leadership, equipping participants to successfully navigate and make a significant contribution to the altered legal environment created by the three new criminal statutes.
